Downie offers a vibrant, kaleidoscopic look at the healing arts, bringing together eclectic and engaging excerpts from fiction, poetry, drama, and letters, and by writers as diverse as Paracelsus, Francis Bacon, and Joseph Heller. Here are celebrations and laments, such as in Sylvia Plaths Morning Song (Love set you going like a fat gold watch, The midwife slapped your footsoles, and your bald cry Took its place among the elements); in Hippocrates From Epidemics; in Franz Schuberts eloquent last letter to Franz von Schober, telling of his illness; in Susan Sontags Illness as Metaphor discussing TB and cancer as diseases of passion; or in Philip Larkins acerbic verses on birth, aging, and mourning.
